At the Gwent Valleys Area Committee on Tuesday evening we spoke about a seminar One Voice Wales arranged earlier this month at which Keep Wales Tidy gave a presentation about its latest and biggest ever litter campaign.

Attached as agreed is a copy of the presentation that also includes some ideas on addressing the problem of dog fouling.

I also agreed to provide the email address of Rachel Carter, One Voice Wales, Local Nature Partnership Officer.

Rachel's role is to give advice and guidance to Community & Town Councils about Welsh Government's Local Nature Partnership programme and the various streams of funding available for Councils to enhance the bio-diversity of their local areas.

As well as giving advice and support on funding and applications, Rachel can also give advice and provide ideas on the development of bio diversity projects in communities.

- Caru Cymru is our biggest ever initiative to eradicate litter and waste.
- The vision is for Caru Cymru to be interwoven into life in Wales, so it becomes second nature for everyone to do the right thing.
- By working together to create a clean and safe environment, we can build stronger, healthier communities and make a positive difference to our planet.



Why is Caru Cymru needed?

- The quality of the local environment matters to everyone.
- Poor local environmental quality (LEQ) has far-reaching, negative impacts.
- We need to work together to find new ways of tackling these complex issues.
- Runs until June 2023 – opportunity to make real impact.





Key elements...

A growing army of Litter Champions

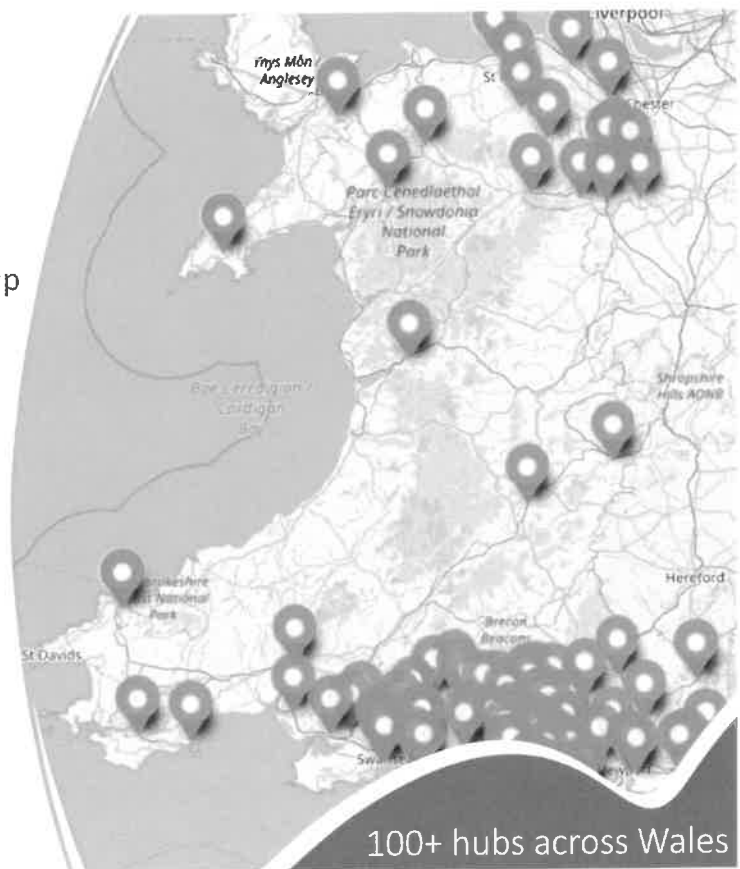
- Relaunched the Litter Champion programme, including a new 'household' category.
- Litter Champions are provided with training, kit, ongoing support and insurance.
- All they have to do is keep in touch and report what they find.
- Over 1,000 Keep Wales Tidy champions across Wales (some local authorities run their own schemes too)
- Kits still available.....



Litter Picking Hubs

- Hold litter picking equipment supplied by Keep Wales Tidy (pickers, hoops, vests, kit bag, red bin bags)
- Anyone can borrow free kit to carry out a clean-up
- Covered by Keep Wales Tidy insurance
- Hubs listed on Keep Wales Tidy online map
- Hub manager must agree to manage hub, run booking system, issue health and safety info and report data
- Virtual hub manager training provided by Keep Wales Tidy
- Great way to engage local people and support them to keep local area tidy

New community groups

- Target to set up 100 new groups to adopt and look after their local area
- Keep Wales Tidy staff can help to constitute, provide training, ongoing support and liaison with local authority
- Keep Wales Tidy will provide free starter kit (five pickers, vests, hoops)
- Keep Wales Tidy will provide free insurance for the first year
- All groups have to do is keep in touch and report their activities via a simple app.

Litter Free Zones for businesses and schools

- Aim = 100 organisations to maintain litter free zones around their premises
- Launch in October
- Business buys kit, adopts local area, undertakes regular clean-ups and uploads data
- Keep Wales Tidy provides PR materials (e.g. window stickers), adds business to online map, social media, and provides health and safety/reporting training

Adopt A Highway Trial

- Community groups 'adopt' a stretch of suitable road (no more than 2km)
- Signage installed along adopted stretch promoting adoptee
- Clean up min. of 4 times per year
- Liaise with LA

- LA collects and weighs waste

Local Trials

- 6 - 8 week trial to tackle a local LEQ issue and assess results
- New methods implemented
- Interventions purchased
- Baseline data, and regular monitoring
- Results assessed and shared
- Issues being tackled: roadside litter, smoking litter, recycling of household waste in multiple occupancy buildings, community recycling on streets, smashed glass, fast food, fly-tipping, skatepark litter, microchip bin/sack trials, #2minutebeachclean





Questions

National awareness raising campaigns

- Delivered 'Make Memories Not Mess' campaign in spring /summer to tackle 'lockdown litter'.
- Coordinated, positive messaging, encouraging people to be prepared and take their litter home.
- Roadside litter campaign in development, due to be launched spring 2022.
- Fly-tipping campaign in development. Due to be launched late 2022.





Dog fouling campaign

- Focus on animal health, picking up after your dog being the social norm, and looking after your local area
- Physical interventions including bin stickers and pawprints to bins
- Huge engagement already through our social media competition to find our dog models

Title: COP Cymru – shaping Wales’ response to the climate emergency

The climate is changing and so must Wales.

COP Cymru is an opportunity for all of us to help shape Wales’ future. With a series of events taking place in Wales from 28 October until 26 November, people across Wales will have the opportunity to engage in important conversations about climate change.

COP Cymru will focus on the national mission to make the 2020s a ‘decade of climate action’ and lay the foundations for a Net Zero Wales.

It begins with the launch of the new Net Zero Wales Plan. With speakers and the media attending the Solar Heat Energy Demonstrator building near Port Talbot, Welsh Ministers will set out to a virtual audience a five-year plan of action, explaining the role of the plan in shaping future climate action and emphasising the importance of working together to help deliver the ambition.

But that’s not all. While COP26 is taking place in Glasgow, four COP26 virtual Regional Roadshow events will be filmed in Wales and broadcast to a live audience:

- Energy Transition (4 November)
- Nature-Based Solutions (6 November)
- Adaptation & Resilience (8 November)
- Clean Transport (10 November)

The events will include panel sessions held in the regions with the audience joining virtually via the COP Cymru event platform. The programme on each day will be shaped by people and organisations from across Wales, highlighting examples of best practice and helping to start important conversations around the key COP themes.

The COP Cymru programme concludes with Wales Climate Week: a Wales-wide conversation on how we can tackle the climate emergency, taking place online, from 22 to 26 November. The five-day programme of virtual events - each day focusing on a different theme – will explore Wales’ contribution to the global challenge of combating climate change and attempt to answer key questions, such as how we can use nature to manage climate risks and how everyone can make a contribution to achieving a net zero Wales.

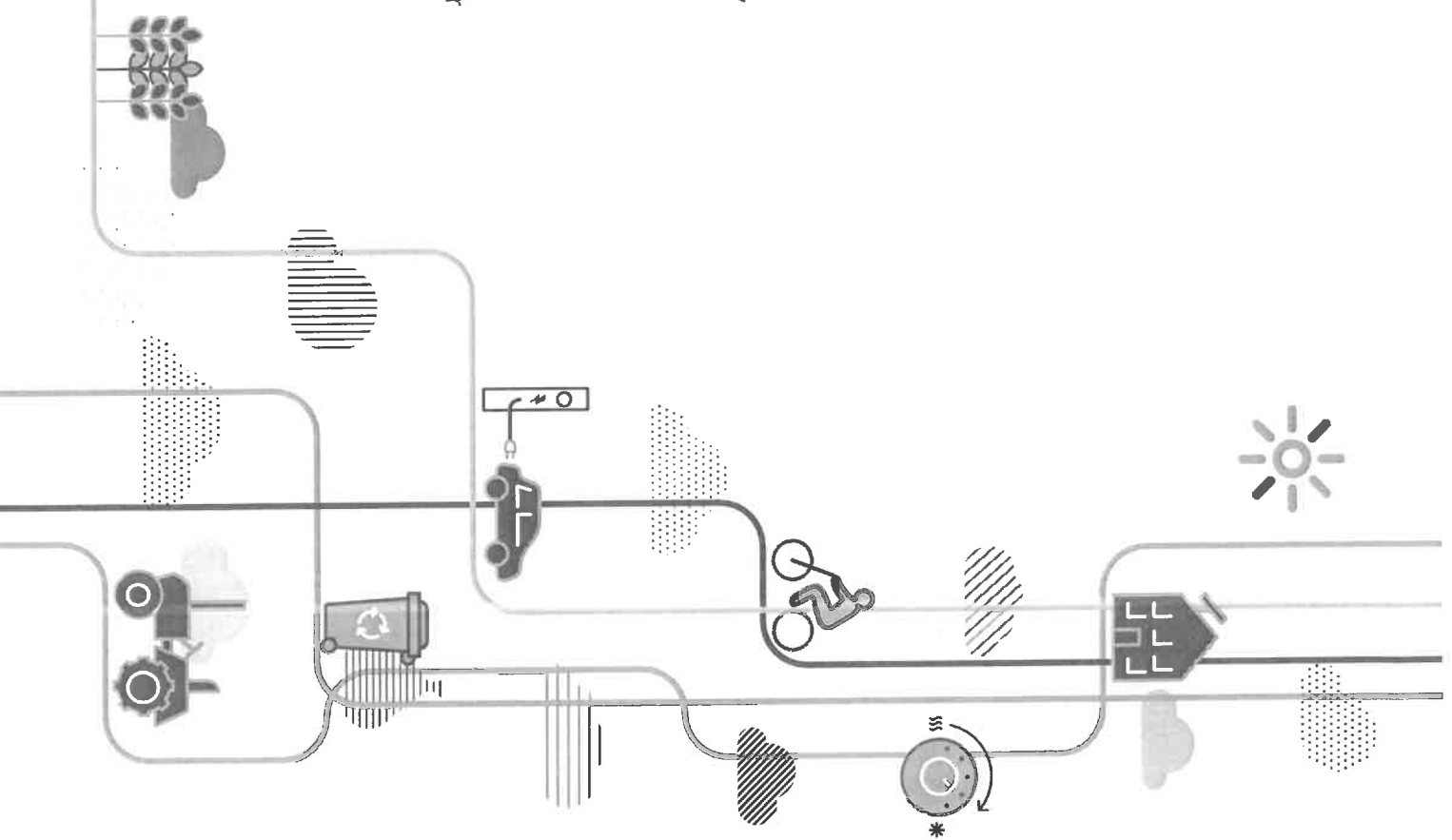

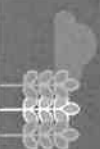
